I saw a lot of new faces out there voting, which is great to see. Again, the membership will have the final say on their contract this month. If the membership likes the contract the company gives them, then it's their choice to vote for it. If the membership doesn't like it, then the company knows what'll happen.

We started negotiations with the company **Tuesday July 9th**. Again, we will be basing our negotiation strategy on the surveys filled out by the membership. Keep a lookout for information from your stewards about any contract related mobilization actions, like the informational picket. **Wear buttons, wear your red shirts, and I encourage everyone to participate in any contract related actions that will possibly take place.** Even though we proved we are willing to strike, a strike is bad for everyone, and actions like the informational picket are how we pressure the company without going out on strike. We will soon be putting out picket schedule assignment sheets. Please fill those out in a timely manner.

The final words to the membership is stay strong and united.

• The CWA Members' Relief Fund (MRF) provides direct assistance to members who are victims of collective bargaining strategies during a sanctioned strike and other approved mobilization actions.

- Currently the weekly benefit to striking workers is
- \$300 per week beginning the 15th day of the strike
- \$400 per week beginning the 29th day of the strike

The local has its own strike fund, from which it will supplement the funds given from the national. The Executive Board has been careful to save money where it can so that every penny could go towards helping members during a strike.

1. In 2023, Elbit Systems reported a net income of \$1.1 billion.

2. This factory alone has a **\$500 million** contract with the US government, along with other contracts in the **\$10s of millions.**

3. Workers must wait a year before they get one week of vacation.

4. Some workers start off as low as \$17/hr.

5. During a maintenance shutdown, the company **forces** all employees to use their already limited vacation for that shutdown week. Meaning that for some, half of their vacation is gone, and for others, **all of their vacation is gone**.

6. In 2020, the company froze the pension that had been in place since 1958.
